crime advice at the pre planning stages in respect of this proposed Masterplan application to the Local Authority and the applicant. Should the two above developments progress through the planning process as stated at the pre planning design stages, I

recommend that it is a condition of all planning applications associated with the larger scheme for the area that the police preferred security specification Secured by Design (SBD) certification is achieved.

A development of this size and scale has the potential to create additional demand on local policing resources, therefore in order to create a safe and secure environment crime prevention strategies should be integrated into the design of the development at the earliest opportunity. Secured by Design certified developments have been proven to experience less vehicle crime, burglary and criminal damage.
